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The toy created with this pattern you can use as you wish.

Tools and materials for chamomile gnome:



- Yarn Himalaya Dolphin baby (100 g/120 m) green № 80307 (for body and arms) 1 skein, yellow № 80313 (for cap and hands) less than 1 skein, white № 80301 (for beard and chamomile) 1/4 of a skein, beige № 80342 (for face and nose), mustard №80330 (for feet and chamomile);
- Yarn YarnArt Jeans (50 g/160 m) white Nº 01 (for sewing hands to the beard and for sewing the beard to the body), yellow Nº 67 (for sewing cap to the head);
- Fiberfill;
- Hook Clover № 5.0 mm and 3.5 mm or ordinary hooks 4.5 mm and 3.0 mm;
- Safety eyes 12 mm;
- Scissors, pins, needle with a wide eye for assembling the toy;
- Marker.

When using indicated materials, the height of the toy will be 35-37 cm.

I crochet using the "yarn under" method.

For all the parts, except the chamomile, I used the hook Clover № 5.0 mm.


Instead of Himalaya Dolphin baby, you can use YarnArt Dolce yarn, but in this case, the yarn consumption will be more.



Tools and materials for the lilac gnome:



- Yarn Himalaya Dolphin baby (100 g/120 m) green № 80307 (for body and arms) 1 skein, violet № 80305 (for cap and hands) less than 1 skein, white № 80301 (for beard and lilac) 1/4 of a skein, beige № 80342 (for face and nose), yellow № 80313 (for feet and lilac);
- Yarn YarnArt Jeans (50 g/160 m) white Nº 01 (for sewing hands to the beard and for sewing the beard to the body), violet Nº 89 (for sewing cap to the head);
- Fiberfill;
- Hook Clover № 5.0 mm and 3.5 mm or ordinary hooks 4.5 mm and 3.0 mm;
- Safety eyes 12 mm;
- Scissors, pins, needle with a wide eye for assembling the toy;
- Marker.



I crochet using the "yarn under" method.

Tools and materials for the narcissus gnome:



- Yarn Himalaya Dolphin baby (100 g/120 m) green № 80307 (for body and arms) 1 skein, turquoise № 80315 (for cap and feet) less than 1 skein, white № 80301 (for beard and narcissus) 1/4 of a skein, beige № 80342 (for face and nose), yellow № 80313 (for narcissus);
- Yarn YarnArt Jeans (50 g/160 m) white Nº 01 (for sewing hands to the beard and for sewing the beard to the body), turquoise Nº 81 (for sewing cap to the head);
- Fiberfill;
- Hook Clover № 5.0 mm and 3.5 mm or ordinary hooks 4.5 mm and 3.0 mm;
- Safety eyes 12 mm;
- Scissors, pins, needle with a wide eye for assembling the toy;
- Marker.



When using indicated materials, the height of the toy will be 35-37 cm.

I crochet using the "yarn under" method.

For all the parts, except the chamomile, I used the hook № 5.0 mm.

Instead of Himalaya Dolphin baby, you can use YarnArt Dolce yarn, but in this case, the yarn consumption will be more.

Abbreviations:

- sc single crochet
- inc increase
- dec decrease
- hdc half double crochet
- dc double crochet
- FLO front loop only

- BLO-back loop only
- tr treble crochet
- dtr double treble crochet
- sl st slip stitch
- ch chain
- * repeat

Crochet in continuous rounds, without slip stitches and chains, unless indicated in the description.

The pattern will be shown in the example of a lilac gnome.

The body of all three gnomes is made with the same pattern.

The caps of the chamomile gnome and the lilac gnome are made with the same pattern, but the pattern for the cap of the narcissus gnome is different.

The arms of the chamomile gnome and the lilac gnome are made with the same pattern, but the pattern of the narcissus gnome's arms is different, see pages 8-9. Flowers are also made in different ways, see pages 19-21.

Throughout the pattern, I change the color of the yarn in the traditional way.







> Suitable for chamomile gnome and lilac gnome

Begin crocheting, using violet/yellow color. Hook Clover 5.0 mm.

2 details. Right, and left arms are made in the same way (except round 7). Ch 2.

1 rnd: into the 2nd ch from the hook 6 sc (6). Place the marker.

2 rnd: 6 inc (12)

3-4 rnds (2 rounds): 12 sc (12)

In the next round crochet a thumb.

5 rnd: bobble stitch with 3 dc into first st, 1 ch, dec, 9 sc (12)

6 rnd: (1 sc, dec)*4 (8)

7 rnd: 8 sc (8). Stuff the detail. From this point do not stuff anymore.

Right arm:

Change the color to green. Leave a long tail (approx 30 cm) of violet/yellow color. Cut and fasten off the yarn.

Left arm:

Crochet 3 more sc using violet/yellow color. Place the marker. This is the new beginning of the round. Change the color to green. Leave a long tail (approx 30 cm) of violet/yellow color. Cut and fasten off the

yarn.


8 rnd: BLO 8 sc (8). Bring the violet/yellow yarn to the front (photo 5).

9-14 rnds (6 rounds): 8 sc (8).

The 14th rnd must end at the thumb level (photo 6).

If necessary, make shift stitches by crocheting an extra 1-3 sc or, or contrary, unravel.













Press the detail to make it flat. Crochet 4 sc, inserting the hook through both layers, (photo 7).

Cut and fasten off the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Attach the violet/yellow color to the loose from loops of round 7. (photo 8).

Ch 1, 7 sc, sl st into the ch (8).

Cut and fasten off the violet/yellow color and weave in the end.



$\mathsf{Arms}\ 2 \longrightarrow \mathsf{Suitable}\ \mathsf{for}\ \mathsf{narcissus}\ \mathsf{gnome}$

Begin crocheting, using beige color. Hook Clover 5.0 mm.

2 details. The right and left hands are made in the same way (except for the

7th round).

Ch 2.

1 rnd: into the 2nd ch from the hook 6 sc (6). Place the marker.

2 rnd: 6 inc (12)

3-4 rnds (2 rounds): 12 sc (12)

In the next round crochet a thumb.

5 rnd: bobble stitch with 3 dc into first st, ch1, dec, 9 sc (12)

6 rnd: (1 sc, dec)*4 (8)

7 rnd: 8 sc (8)

Stuff the detail. From this point do not stuff anymore.







Right hand:

Change the color to green.

Cut and fasten off the beige color.

Left hand:

Crochet 3 more sc using beige yarn. Place the marker.

This is a new beginning of the round.

Change the color to green. Cut and fasten off the beige color.

8 rnd: 8 sl st (8)

9 rnd: BLO 8 sc (8)

10-15 rnds (6 rounds): 8 sc (8)

Round 15 should end at the level of the thumb (photo 15).

If necessary, make shift stitches, that is crochet an additional 1-3 sc or unravel.

Press the detail to make it flat. Crochet 4 sc, inserting the hook through both

layers (photo 16).

Cut and fasten off the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Nose \longrightarrow Suitable for all the gnomes

Crochet, using beige color. Hook Clover 5.0 mm.


Ch 2.

1 rnd: into the 2nd ch from the hook 6 sc (6)

2 rnd: 6 inc (12)

3 rnd: (4 sc, dec)*2 (10), sl st.

Cut and fasten off the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.







Beard

Suitable for all the gnomes

Crochet, using white color. Hook Clover 5.0 mm.

Before chaining, leave a long tail (approx 100 cm) for crocheting the beard into the body.

Ch 17.

Crochet in rows. At the end of each row ch 1 and turn.

1 row: from the 2 ch from the hook 16 sc (16)

2 row: dec, 12 sc, dec (14)

3 row: dec, 10 sc, dec (12)

4 row: dec, 8 sc, dec (10)

5 row: 10 sc (10)

6 row: dec, 6 sc, dec (8)

7 row: 8 sc (8)

8 row: dec, 4 sc, dec (6)


9 row: 6 sc (6)

10 row: dec, 2 sc, dec (4)

11 row: 2 dec (2)

12 row: 1 dec (1). Do not cut the yarn, (photo 20).

Continue crocheting.






• When crocheting at the right and left corners of the beard, make 1 ch.

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Cut and fasten off the yarn and hide on the wrong side of the detail. The beard is done.



Head+body — Suitable for all the gnomes

Crochet, using green color. Hook Clover 5.0 mm.

Before crocheting round 21, choose the most convenient for you, way to attach the details.

Ch 9.

1 rnd: from the 2nd ch from the hook 7 sc, 3 sc into the last st, 6 sc, inc (18)

Place the marker.

2 rnd: inc, 6 sc, 3 inc, 6 sc, 2 inc (24)

3 rnd: 1 sc, inc, 6 sc, (1 sc, inc)*3, 6 sc, (1 sc, inc)*2 (30)

4 rnd: (14 sc, inc)*2 (32)

5 rnd: 32 sc (32)

6 rnd: (15 sc, inc)*2 (34)

7 rnd: 34 sc (34)

8 rnd: (16 sc, inc)*2 (36)

9 rnd: (17 sc, inc)*2 (38)

10 rnd: (18 sc, inc)*2 (40)

11 rnd: (19 sc, inc)*2 (42)

12 rnd: (20 sc, inc)*2 (44)

13 rnd: (21 sc, inc)*2 (46)

14 rnd: (22 sc, inc)*2 (48)

15 rnd: (23 sc, inc)*2 (50)

16 rnd: 50 sc (50)

In the next round, begin

crochet the face.



In order for the face to be located in the middle, it is necessary that the next round starts on the side.

Fold the detail so that the first round is strictly parallel to the work surface. (photo 29).

It is very important that the 17th round starts on the side.

To do this, I unraveled 5 sc in the 16th round (you may have a different amount) and put a marker (photo 30).

In the next round, we add a new color - beige.

Do not cut the yarn if it is not indicated in the pattern.

17-18 rnds (2 rounds): green 5 sc, beige 16 sc, green 29 sc (50)

19 rnd: green inc, 4 sc, beige 16 sc, green 4 sc, inc, 24 sc (52)

20 rnd: green 6 sc, beige 16 sc (cut and fasten off the beige color), green 30 sc (52)

At this point, you should have 4 rounds of beige (photo 33).

The face is ready!

In the next round, we crochet arms/arms + beard.







Next, I offer 2 options for attaching a beard and arms in the 21st round.

1option: crochet the arms and beard in.

2 option: crochet only arms in and sew the beard on.











21 rnd: 2 sc, 4 sc together with the stitches of the right arm (photo 36), the color transition should be facing you. Change the color to white, 16 sc together with the stitches of the beard, the wrong side of the beard should face you, (photo 37).







Change the color to green (photo 38). Cut and fasten off the white color, 4 sc together with the stitches of the left arm (photo 39), 26 sc (52)

21 rnd: 2 sc, 4 sc together with the stitches of the right arm (photo 42), at the moment of crocheting in, the color transition should face you, 16 sc, 4 sc together with the stitches of the left arm (photo 43), at the moment of crocheting in, the color transition should face you, 26 sc (52)

For this gnome, I chose the 2nd option for attaching details.

If you use safety eyes, insert them between the next-to-last and last rounds of beige color at a distance of 2 sc between the tips of the safety eyes (photo 45).

Stuff the detail.

22-23 rnds (2 rounds): 52 sc (52)

24 rnd: inc, 27 sc, inc, 23 sc (54). Increases in this round should be located on the sides. Make shift stitches if necessary.

25 rnd: 54 sc (54)

26 rnd: 12 sc, inc, 13 sc, inc, 12 sc, inc, 13 sc, inc (58)

27-31 rnds (5 rounds): 58 sc (58)

32 rnd: 2 dec, 25 sc, 2 dec, 25 sc (54)

Decreases in this round should be located on the sides. Make shift stitches if necessary.


33-34 rnds (2 rounds): 54 sc (54)

35 rnd: (7 sc, dec)*6 (48)

36 rnd: 3 sc, dec, (6 sc, dec)*5, 3 sc (42)

37 rnd: (5 sc, dec)*6 (36)

38 rnd: 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec)*5, 2 sc (30)







39 rnd: (3 sc, dec)*6 (24)

40 rnd: (2 sc, dec)*6 (18)

Stuff the bottom of the detail tightly.

41 rnd: (1 sc, dec)*6 (12)

42 rnd: 6 dec (6)

Tighten the hole. Cut and fasten off the yarn. Weave in the end.

Feet — Suitable for all the gnomes

Crochet, using yellow/turquoise/mustard color. Hook Clover 5.0 mm.

2 details.

Ch 5.

1 rnd: from the 2nd ch from the hook 3 sc, 3 sc into the last stitch, 2 sc, inc (10)

2 rnd: inc, 2 sc, 3 inc, 2 sc, 2 inc (16)

3 rnd: 1 sc, inc, 2 sc, (1 sc, inc)*3, 2 sc, (1 sc, inc)*2 (22)

4 rnd: BLO 22 sc (22)

5 rnd: 7 sc, 4 dec, 7 sc (18)

6 rnd: 4 sc, (1 sc, dec)*3, 5 sc (15)


Stuff the detail.

7 rnd: 5 sc, 2 dec, 6 sc (13), sl st.

Cut and fasten off the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Crochet the second detail in the same way.











Cap Suitable for chamomile gnome and lilac gnome

Crochet, using violet/yellow color. Hook Clover 5.0 mm.

Crochet loosely or use hook Clover 5.5 mm.

Ch 2.

1 rnd: into the 2nd ch from the hook 6 sc (6)

2 rnd: (2 sc, inc)*2 (8)

3-7 rnds (5 rounds): 8 sc (8)

8 rnd: (3 sc, inc)*2 (10)

9 rnd: (4 sc, inc)*2 (12)

10 rnd: (5 sc, inc)*2 (14)

11 rnd: (6 sc, inc)*2 (16)

12 rnd: (7 sc, inc)*2 (18)

13 rnd: 18 sc (18)

14 rnd: (8 sc, inc)*2 (20)

15 rnd: (9 sc, inc)*2 (22)

16 rnd: (10 sc, inc)*2 (24)

17 rnd: (11 sc, inc)*2 (26)

18 rnd: (12 sc, inc)*2 (28)

19 rnd: (13 sc, inc)*2 (30)

20 rnd: (14 sc, inc)*2 (32)

21 rnd: (15 sc, inc)*2 (34)

22 rnd: (16 sc, inc)*2 (36)

23 rnd: (17 sc, inc)*2 (38)

24 rnd: (18 sc, inc)*2 (40)

25 rnd: (19 sc, inc)*2 (42)

26 rnd: (20 sc, inc)*2 (44)

27 rnd: (21 sc, inc)*2 (46)

28 rnd: (22 sc, inc)*2 (48)

29 rnd: (23 sc, inc)*2 (50)

30 rnd: (24 sc, inc)*2 (52)

31 rnd: (25 sc, inc)*2 (54)

32 rnd: 54 sc (54)

33 rnd: (26 sc, inc)*2 (56)

34 rnd: 5 sc, 17 sl st, 5 sc, inc, 27 sc,

inc (58)



Cap $2 \longrightarrow$ Suitable f0r the narcissus gnome

Crochet 26 rounds, using the turquoise color following the "Cap 1" pattern. Hook Clover 5.0 mm.

Crochet loosely or use hook Clover 5.5 mm.

27 rnd: 6 sc, FLO 9 sc, 6 sc, inc, 21 sc, inc (46)

28 rnd: (22 sc, inc)*2 (48)

In the next round, we crochet the first fold.

29 rnd: 6 sc, 9 sc together with the BLO o§§f the 27th round, 8 sc,

inc, 23 sc, inc (50)

30 rnd: (24 sc, inc)*2 (52)

31 rnd: 2 sc, FLO 19 sc, 4 sc, inc, 25 sc, inc (54)

32 rnd: 54 sc (54)

In the next round, we crochet the second fold.

33 rnd: 2 sc, 19 sc together with BLO of the 31st round, 5 sc, inc,

26 sc, inc (56)

34 rnd: 5 sc, 17 sl st, 5 sc, inc, 27 sc, inc (58)

35 rnd: 5 sc, 17 sl st, 36 sc (58), sl st.

Cut and fasten off the yarn. Hide the end on the wrong side of the

cap.

Pom Pom — Suitable for chamomile gnome and lilac gnome

Crochet, using white color. Hook Clover № 5.0 mm.

Ch 2.

1 rnd: into 2 ch from the hook 6 sc (6). Place the marker.

2 rnd: 6 inc (12)

3 rnd: (1 sc, inc)*6 (18)

4-5 rnds (2 rounds): 18 sc (18)

6 rnd: (1 sc, dec)*6 (12). Stuff the detail tightly.

7 rnd: 6 dec (6)

Tighten the hole. Cut and fasten of the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Lilac

3 details.

Begin crocheting, using yellow color. Hook Clover 3.5 mm.

Ch 2.

1 rnd: into 2 ch from the hook 8 sc (8).

Change the color to white. Cut and fasten off the yellow yarn.

Place the marker.

2 rnd: 1 petal: ch 4, next crochet along the chain, beginning from the 2nd ch from the hook: 3 sc, 2 sc along the yellow stitches. Repeat these steps 3 more times.

3 rnd: (sc, hdc, 3 hdc into the ch, hdc, sc, sl st, skip 1 stitch, sc)*3

last petal: sc, hdc, 3 hdc into the ch, hdc, sc, sl st, skip one stitch, sl st. Cut and fasten off the yarn and hide the end on the wrong side of the detail.

3 details.

Begin crocheting, using mustard color.

Hook Clover 3.5 mm.

Ch 2.

1 rnd: into the 2nd ch 5 sc (5)

2 rnd: 5 inc (10)


Change the color to white. Cut and fasten off the mustard color.

Yarn over and pull through all the loops on the hook, secure with ch 1+ch 3, sl st into the next stitch.


The first petal is finished! Crochet the rest of the petals the same way. Cut and fasten off the yarn,


leaving a long tail for sewing.


























Narcissus

Crochet, using yellow color. Hook Clover 3.5 mm.

Ch 2.

1 rnd: into the 2nd ch from the hook 5 sc (5). Place the marker.

2 rnd: 5 inc (10)

3 rnd: ch 1, FLO 10 hdc, sl st into the ch (10)

4 rnd: (sc, ch)*10 (20), sl st.

Cut and fasten off the yarn. Weave in the end.

Attach the white color yarn to the front loose loops of the 3rd round,

ch 1, inc into next st, next crochet as follows:

 $(1 \text{ sc, inc})^*4$, sl st into the ch (15)

Begin crocheting the 1st petal:


Ch 3, (dc, tr, dtr,) into 1 stitch, picot: ch3, sl st into the 2nd st from the hook,

work into next stitch: (dtr, tr, dc, ch 3, sl st), 2 sl st.

Crochet 4 more petals, repeat the previous steps.



Assembly and design










• Pin the beard where the color transitions from beige to green and sew it on.

• Step down one row from the top of the beard and pin the nose.











Pin the beard.









• And sew it on around the perimeter inserting the needle between the posts, NOT between the loops, using white YarnArt Jeans.

• And sew it on around the perimeter inserting • Put the cap on the gnome and pin the flowers to the cap.

• Remove the cap, pull all the loose ends of the flowers on the wrong side, using the hook, and tie

them together.



• Using the longest white yarn end, sew the flowers to the cap.



• Carefully weave in the ends of the yarn between the posts.



- The cap is finished.
- Put it on the gnome.











- Pin the cap to the head.
- The side green color in this area on both sides should remain under the cap. Sew the cap to the head.





• Pin the feet so that the gnome's arms lie neatly on them.

• Also, make a few stitches at the top of the head so the cap will hold even more securely.







• Gnome is finished!




