The difficulty level is medium. This master class is designed for people who already have crocheting skills.

## For crocheting you will need:

- 1. <u>basic color</u> Gazzal baby cotton (60% cotton, 40% acrylic) orange color # 3419 (50g / 165mt) 1/4 skein;
  - 2. Gazzal baby cotton (60% cotton, 40% acrylic) black color #3433 (50g / 165mt) little bit;
  - 3. YarnArt Angora Star (20% wool, 80% acrylic) white color #501 (100g / 500mt) small amount;
- 4. hook №2 or any other hook, according to the selected yarn;5. black beads for eyes;

6. filler;

- 7. needle for sewing the nose and eyebrows, long needle for sewing the details;
  - 8. wire for the tail and legs(if you wish);9. pins;

10. scissors.

## **Symbols:**

sc - single crochet
hdc - half double crochet
dc - double crochet
tr - treble crochet
ch - chain (stitch)
dec - decrease
inc - increase
sl st - slip stitch





The height of the finished fox is 17cm (6,7 inches) including legs.





#### START TO CROCHET FROM THE TAIL

Take white yarn. I used the thread in 2 layers.

2. (1 sc + inc) × 3 (9)

Next, change the color of the thread to the basic

Add the filler.

**16.** 
$$(3 \text{ sc} + \text{dec}) \times 3$$

If you want the tail to bend, insert the wire and add the filler. Cut off the end of the thread, the tail will be tied into the body.

# Next, crochet the body, starting with the legs. Legs (2 details)

Take the black thread.

1. 6sc in amigurumi ring (6)

2 - 4. 6 sc (3 rows)

In the next row start to form the heels in turning rows. The entire heel is united in one row, although there are actually three of them due to the turns.



5. 4 sc + ch , turn, 4 sc + ch, turn, 4 sc, 2 sc (on the turning chains), 2 sc, 2 sc (on the turning chains), 4 sc (10) Place the marker. Fill the heel.

6. 1 dec, 2 sc, 1 dec, 4 sc (8)

7 - 9.8 sc (3 rows)

Add the filler. Change the thread to basic color

10.4 sc, inc, 3 sc (9)

11.9 sc

12.  $(2 \text{ sc} + \text{inc}) \times 3$  (12)

13.  $(3 \text{ sc} + \text{inc}) \times 3$  (15)

If you want the legs to bend, insert the wire and add the filler.

14. Crochet 15sc+3sc (additionally, to align the legs) on the first leg, cut off and secure the thread.

Crochet 13sc on the second leg+3ch. Next, crochet sl st with last loop on the first leg.



Due to the difference in crochet density, you may have a different number of shift stitches. Put the legs together, look at the top of both parts and determine the stitches where the legs will be connected. It will be the last stitch on the first and second leg.

15. Crochet 15 sc + 3 sc on chain loops of the first leg, 15 sc + sc on chain loops of the second leg.

Place the marker.

16.36 sc

17.  $(5 \text{ sc+ inc}) \times 6$  (42)

18. 42 sc

19. (6 sc+ inc) × 6 (48)

Then crochet the tail. Add the filler while the crocheting.

**24.** 42 sc

Stuff tightly. Leave the thread for sewing.





## Head

#### Start crocheting with basic color yarn.

- 1. 6 sc in amigurumi ring
- 2. 6 inc (12). Place the marker.
- 3.  $(1 \text{ sc} + \text{inc}) \times 6$  (18)
- 4.  $(2 \text{ sc} + \text{inc}) \times 6$  (24)
- 5.  $(3 \text{ sc} + \text{inc}) \times 6$  (30)
- 6.  $(4 \text{ sc} + \text{inc}) \times 6$  (36)
- 7.  $(5 \text{ sc} + \text{inc}) \times 6$  (42)
- 8-9. 42 sc ( 2 rows)
- 10.  $(6 \text{ sc} + \text{inc}) \times 6$  (48)
- 11-12. 48 sc ( 2 rows)
- 13. 12 sc , inc, 22 sc , inc, 12 sc (50)
- **14.** 10 sc , (1 sc + inc) × 3, 8 sc , 2 inc, 8 sc , (inc+ 1 sc ) × 3, 10 sc (58)



#### Next change the thread to white. I used the thread in 2 layers.

- 15. 10 sc , (2 sc + inc) × 3, 8 sc, (sc + inc) × 2, 8 sc , (inc+ 2 sc ) × 3, 10 sc (66)
- **16.** 66 sc
- 17. 10 sc , (2 sc + dec) × 3, 8 sc , (sc + dec) × 2, 8 sc , (dec + 2 sc ) × 3, 10 sc (58)
- 18. 10 sc, (sc + dec) × 3, 8 sc, 2 dec, 8 sc, (dec+ 1 sc) × 3, 10 sc (50)
- 19. 12 sc , dec, 22 sc , dec, 12 sc (48)
- **20.** 48 sc

If you want the eyes on a secure mount, insert them between the 13 and 14 rows. At a distance of 10 sc.

Fasten off. Cut off and secure the thread.



## Hands

#### 2 details

Start crocheting with black color yarn.

- 1. 6 sc in amigurumi ring
- 2.  $(1 \text{ sc+ inc}) \times 3$  (9)
- **3-5.** 9 sc (3 rows)

Add the filler while the crocheting.

Change the thread to basic color.

**6-11.** 9 sc (6 rows)

**12.** (sc + dec)  $\times$  3 (6)

13. 3 dec.

Tighten the hole, close the crocheting.



#### Ears

2 details with white color (the thread in 2 layers) and 2 details with basic color

- 1.6sc in amigurumi ring
- 2. 6 inc (12)

Place the marker in the first loop of 3-h row.

3. sc, inc, sc, dc, dc+dc, (cluster) dc+ch+tr+ch+dc, dc+hdc, hdc, sc, inc, sc, skip the last sc(19)

Place the marker in the last loop. Take the white color detail and basic color detail and fold them in half. Fold them so, that the increases look up, this will be the top of the ear. Crochet from right to left. The beginning and end of the binding match the location of the markers.

Crochet with basic color 6 sc, then change the color to black 3sc, ch+dc+ch, 3sc, change the color to basic and crochet 6sc. Leave the thread of basic color to sew the ear to the head.









# **Assembling**

- 1. Sew on the ears between rows 4 and 7. For convenience, you can mark it with needles.
- 2. Tightening. You need a long needle and a strong thread or thread in the color of crocheting . Place the needle between rows 15  $\mu$  16 in the distance of 10sc (from the center of the nose by 5sc). Tighten. Enter the needle from the bottom where you finished crocheting (1), pull it out at the location of the left pin (2), move one sc to the center (3), pull it out at the location of the left pin (5), move one sc to the center (6) and pull it out the needle from the bottom (1). Now you can tighten it. Quite strongly, so that a nose is formed during the tightening. Leave the thread until you finish making out the muzzle (at the end, adjust the tension to get the muzzle of the form you like, then fix the thread and tie a few knots, hide the thread). Take the beads and sew eyes in place of tightening. Sew in the same way as you made the tightening.







## **Assembling**

3. Embroider the nose between 15 and 16 rnds. The stitch length is 3sc.

The top of the eyebrows is between 8 and 9 rnds, the bottom is between 10 and 11 rnds (3sc diagonally). Between the top of the eyebrows - 5sc.

Embroider the mouth between 18 and 19 rnds. The stitch length is 1sc.

4. Sew on the arms between rows 34 and 35. I sewed it with a thread attachment, then the arms will move.







To attach the hands, you need to step back 2 rnds from the top
Mark the location with the needles.
Photos show how to sewing the arms.

5. Sew the head to the body. White yarn can be combed.
