KEYRING RAT GEORGE

Crochet Pattern

MATERIALS & TOOLS

1. Yarn

I used the yarn Alize Bella (100% cotton, 50 g/180 m)

2. Hook

I used the hook size 1.25

3. Polyester fiber filling

Any toy fiberfill

4. Eyes

2 beads size 4-5 mm

5. Nose

A bead size 6-7 mm

6. Scissors, needle

7. Glue

I used transparent moment glue

8. Key ring

ABBREVIATIONS

MR – magic ring

ch - chain

sc – single crochet

slst - slip stitch

inc - increase

dec - decrease





HEAD

1 row: 6 sc in MR (6)

2 row: (sc, inc)*3 (9)

3 row: (2 sc, inc)*3 (12)

4 row: 12 sc (12)

5 row: (3 sc, inc)*3 (15)

6 row: 15 sc (15)

7 row: (4 sc, inc)*3 (18)

8 row: 18 sc (18)

9 row: (5 sc, inc)*3 (21)

10 row: 21 sc (21)

11 row: (6 sc, inc)*3 (24) **12 row:** (7sc, inc)*3 (27)

13-16 rows: 4 rows=27 sc (27)

17 row: (sc, dec)*9 (18) **18 row:** (sc, dec)*6 (12)

19 row: dec*6 (6)

Stuff the detail in the process.

Cut the yarn, leaving a long tail for muzzle tightening.

Glue the nose on the tip but slightly down. Note, that the nose should look down, when you will glue eyes and sew ears.

Thread the yarn tail into the needle, pull the hole tight and then make a tightening from the bottom of the muzzle between rounds 9 and 10. Fasten the thread on the top of the head and weave in the yarn ends.



EARS

1 row: 6 sc in MR (6) 2 row: inc*6 (12)

3 row: (inc, sc)*6 (18)

Cut the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Bend the upper edges slightly when you will sew the ears. Sew them between rounds 17 and 18 through 4-5 stitches of the ears.

Glue the eyes in rounds 7-8 at the distance of 3 stitches between each other (first variant) or in rounds 5-6 at the distance of 1 stitch (second variant).



BODY

1 row: 6 sc in MR (6)

2 row: inc*6 (12)

3 row: (sc, inc)*6 (18) 4 row: (2 sc, inc)*6 (24)

5-10 rows: 6 rows=24 sc (24)

11 row: 6 sc, dec*6, 6 sc (18) - pic. 1

12-13 rows: 2 rows=18 sc (18)

14 row: (4 sc, dec)*3 (15)

15 row: 15 sc (15)

16 row: (3 sc, dec)*3 (12)

17 row: 12 sc (12)

18 row: (2 sc, dec)*3 (9)

Add the fiberfill into the body. Do not stuff the upper part of the body.

Fold the detail in half and crochet 4 sc through the both sides (pic.3). Pay attention, that decreases on the tummy should be in the center.

Cut the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Sew the body to the head between rounds 16 and 17.



ARMS

1 row: 6 sc in MR (6)

2-4 rows: 3 rows=6 sc (6)

5 row: dec*3 (3). Make 8 ch (do not crochet tightly

so that the chain does not twist further)

Add a little bit of fiberfill in the arms.

Cut the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Sew the arms to body on the sides between rounds 15 and 16.



LEGS

1 row: 6 sc in MR (6) 2 row: (sc, inc)*3 (9)

3-4 rows: 2 rows=9 sc (9)

5 row: (sc, dec)*3 (6)

6 row: dec*3 (3). Make 6 ch (do not crochet tightly so that the chain does not twist further)

Add a little bit of fiberfill in the legs.

Cut the yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing. Cut the thread at the one of the legs longer – for a tail.

Sew the legs to the body on the sides between rounds 3 and 4. Sew the leg with the shorter thread first. After sewing the second one, fasten the thread and do not cut it. Bring it back to the point where the tail is (somewhere between the legs). After that, leave the desired length of thread and cut off the extra. Glue the tip of the thread with a transparent glue and twist between the fingers to get a sharp tip.
