Crochet Pattern



Easy Crochet Plushies

## Yarn

### Mini Rubber Ducky - Light Green Version:

· Super Bulky Chenille: Yellow (25 grams), Orange (8 grams), Brown (15 grams).

### Mini Rubber Ducky - Green & Brown Version:

· Super Bulky Chenille: Green (10 grams), Brown (20 grams), Cream (5 grams), Gold (8 grams), Light Pink (2 grams).

### Mini Rubber Ducky - Striped Version:

· Super Bulky Chenille: White (15 grams), Teal (15 grams), Gold (8 grams).

## Other Materials

Main Crochet Hook: size 4.0mm.

Fiberfill.

Black Safety Eyes 12mm (x2).

Scissors & yarn needle.

Stitch Marker.

## Measures

Height when made with the indicated yarn: 4.7 inches.

## About Chenille Yarn

I always work this yarn with a 4.0mm crochet hook. If you crochet very tightly you may need to use a bigger hook, possibly 5.0mm.

Sometimes it is normal to make a mistake while working the pattern. If you need to remove a round you must do so carefully because this yarn tends to fray a lot and often gets stuck. Be patient.

Sewing parts with this type of yarn, can be a complicated process because this yarn frays easily. I recommend using a finer, resistant cotton yarn to sew the parts because it will be much easier to use. Try to find the most similar color.

When you have to work with this yarn and a sewing needle, you should try to look for one that has as large a hole as possible, so that the yarn deteriorates as little as possible.

You can work this pattern with any chenille yarn that meets the following requirements (100g / 3.5oz - 120m / 131yds). Below you can find the most used ones and with which you will obtain the best results:

**Note:** This type of yarn is difficult to visualize on many occasions, so in some processes I will include photographs for your help taken using another yarn that is easier to see.

## General Tips

All parts of this pattern are worked with the main crochet hook listed in the Materials section. If you have to use another size hook it will be indicated on the pattern.

Always use stitch marker to make it easier for you to count the stitches of your round and follow the pattern.

Stuff your project generously, but not too tightly. If you do, the design will lose its shape. For this process I recommend stuffing the pieces while you crochet them, so it will be easier for you.

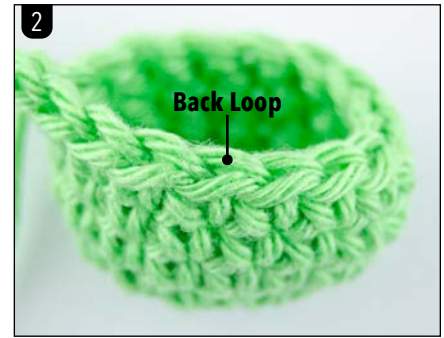
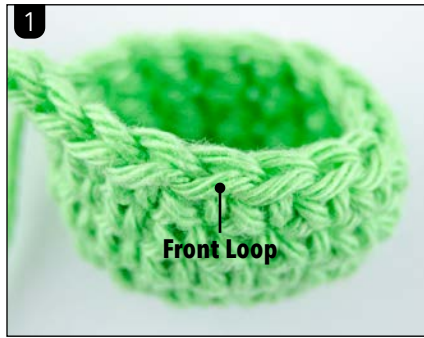
Please note that safety eyes are not recommended for children under 3 years of age. In this case, you must make embroidered eyes.

All my patterns are worked in continuous rounds. When you must work in joined rounds you will have a note at the beginning of the part you are going to crochet.

# Tutorials

## Stitch Loops

In these photos you can see the front loop (*photo 1*) and the back loop (*photo 2*) of a single crochet stitch.



## Starting Ring

The beginning of some pieces of this pattern will not use a regular Magic Ring. We will use another way to start.

Ch 2 (*photo 1*), sc 8 in 2nd ch from hook (*photos 2 & 3*).

*If you prefer, you can also replace this starting way with a Magic Ring with sc 8.*



## SC Increase

Insert the hook under both loops of the indicated stitch, make a single crochet (*photo 1*), insert your hook under both loops of the same stitch and make a second single crochet (*photo 2*).



## Invisible SC Decrease

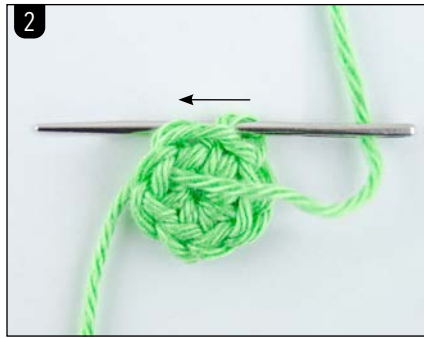
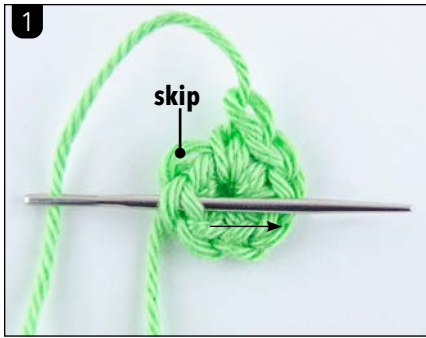
Insert hook into the front loop of the first stitch of the decrease, insert the hook into the front loop of the next stitch of the decrease, yarn over and draw through both loop on hook, yarn over and draw through last two loops on hook (*photo 2*).





**Invisible Fasten Off**

Skip next stitch. Insert the needle into both loops of next stitch, pull yarn through (*photo 1*). Insert the needle through the back loop of the starting stitch (*photo 2*) and tighten it just enough so that the join looks like a regular stitch (*photo 3*).

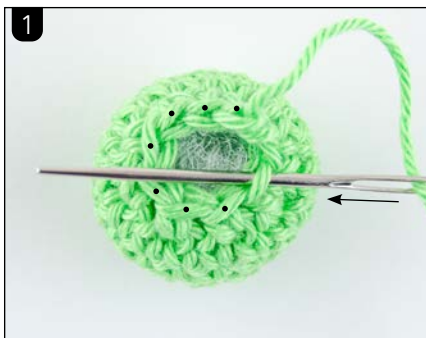
**Color Change**

Make the color change while doing the last step of the last stitch in the first color as follows: work the last stitch with the first color until you only have two loops on the hook (*photo 1*). Now with the new color, grab it around the hook and pull through the 2 remaining loops on your hook (*photo 2*). The next stitch you make will be the first stitch in the new color (*photo 3*).

**Close using the front loops of the last stitches**

Pull the yarn out of the last stitch. Now with your needle, pass the yarn through the front loops of the last stitches of the last round (from outside to inside). Pull the yarn tightly to close the piece (*photos 1, 2 & 3*).

Then hide the yarn inside the piece (*photos 4 & 5*).



# Mini Rubber Duck - Solid version

## Body

With yellow yarn ch 2, sc 8 in second ch from hook.

| <b>02.</b>      | [sc 1, inc] 8x       | (24 sts) |

| <b>09.</b>      | sc 8, [dec] 8x, sc 8 | (24 sts) |

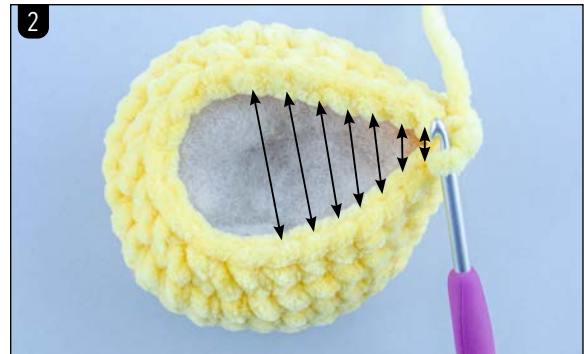
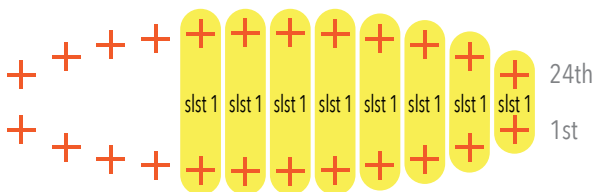
Now you will work the next round to close the top of the duck's body. To do this process you will work two stitches at a time. You must "split" the body into two sides using the first and last stitches of the round you just finished as a reference.

Remember that you will always work all the stitches in this round on two stitches (one on each side). First you will insert your hook into the first and last stitch (*photo 1*), and so on...

- 10.** slst 8 (*photos 2 & 3*). Don't cut the yarn (8 sts)

Look at the chart below to help you.

Stuff the body.



## Head

Continue working the head with the yarn of the body. Jump to the next st (28th st of rnd 8).

- 01.** FLO [inc] 8x (*photo 4*) (16 sts)

Now continue working on round 1 of the head you just made (*photo 5*).

- 02.** [sc 1, inc] 8x (24 sts)



**03 - 07.** (5 rnds) sc 24 (24 sts)

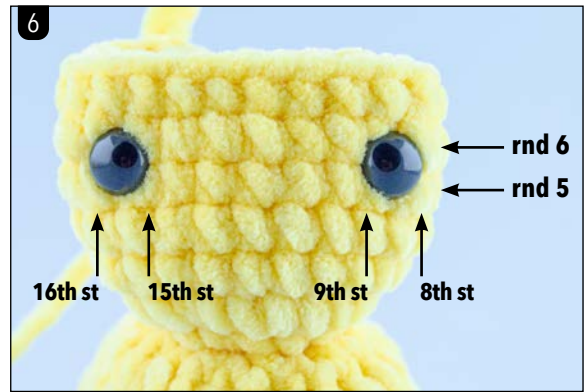
Put the black safety eyes between rnds 5 and 6. The first eye will be placed between stitches 8 and 9. The second eye will be placed between stitches 15 and 16 (*photo 6*).

**08.** [sc 1, dec] 8x (16 sts)

**09.** [dec] 8x (8 sts)

Stuff the head.

Close using the front loops of the last stitches.



If you've worked a little loosely, you may have a small gap between the end of the body seam and the start of the head. If so, you can optionally thread the thread used to finish the head into the body with your needle, then pull it out through this gap to add a few stitches and close it. Fasten off (*photos 7 & 8*).

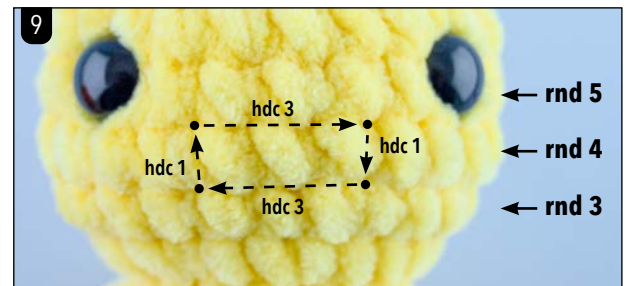


## Beak

To work the beak you must place the open part of the head facing you. You will work around three stitches of rnd 4. These sts are 11th, 12th and 13th.

*You can use this image as a reference during the following explanation.*

Attach a new orange yarn in 11th st between rnds 3 and 4 (*photo 10*).



**01.** {ch 1 + hdc 1} in 11th st, hdc 1 in 12th st, hdc 1 in 13th st (*photo 11*) (4 sts)





Now turn the head 90 degrees to your right to work the second side of the beak (*photo 12*). Insert the hook between sts 13th and 14th of rnd 4.

**01.** hdc 1 (+1 sts)



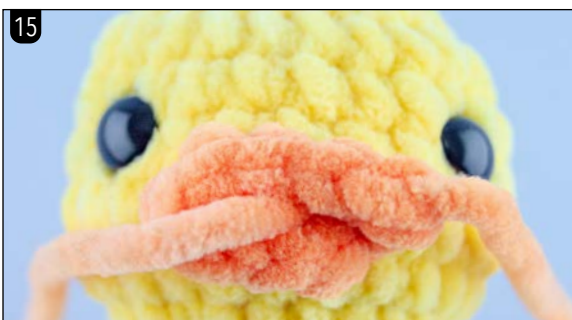
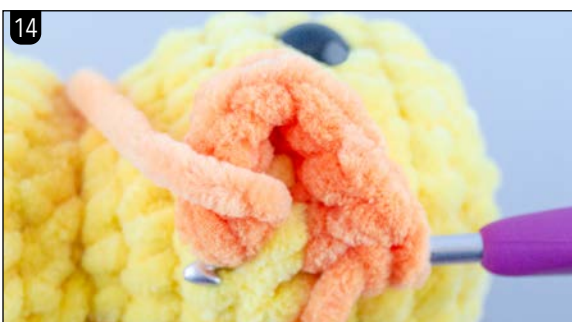
Now turn the head 90 degrees to your right to work the third side of the beak (*photo 13*). Insert the hook in 13th st between rnd 4 and 5.

**01.** hdc 1 in 13th st, hdc 1 in 12th st, hdc 1 in 11th st (+3 sts)



Now turn the head 90 degrees to your right to work the last side of the beak (*photo 14*). Insert the hook between sts 10th and 11th of rnd 4.

**01.** hdc 1 (*photo 15*) (+1 st)



At this moment the beak has two tails (the tail from finishing of the beak and the one left when attaching the yarn to start making it).

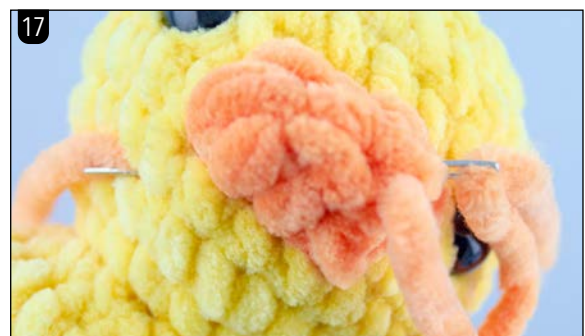
Take the tail that you left when attaching the yarn and with the help of your needle, insert it through the center of the beak and pull it out through a stitch of your choice away from the beak (*photo 16*).



Now, take the tail you used to finish the beak and close it using the front loops of the last stitches.

Then using your needle insert the yarn and pull it out through the same place where you pulled out the other tail (*photo 17*).

Finally, tie a knot with the two tails and leave them inside the head (*photos 18 & 19*).



## Cheeks

Make the cheeks under the eyes with a little blush and a soft brush (*photo 20*).

## Cowboy Hat

With brown yarn ch 5.

| <b>01.</b> | sc 1 in 2nd ch from hook, sc 2 ( <i>photo 21</i> ),<br>3 sc on the last ch ( <i>photo 22</i> ), turn and work<br>on the other side of the foundation chs,<br>sc 2 ( <i>photo 23</i> ), inc in next ch ( <i>photo 24</i> ) | (10 sts) |
| <b>02.</b> | inc, sc 2, [inc] 3x, sc 2, [inc] 2x   | (16 sts) |
| <b>03.</b> | BLO sc 16   | (16 sts) |
| <b>04.</b> | sc 1, inc, sc 2, [sc 1, inc] 3x, sc 2, [sc 1, inc] 2x   | (22 sts) |
| <b>05.</b> | sc 22   | (22 sts) |
| <b>06.</b> | FLO [sc 1, inc] 11x   | (33 sts) |
| <b>07.</b> | sc 33. Invisible fasten off.  | (33 sts) |

Pull the brim of the hat up to give it its final shape (*photo 25*).

Finally place the cowboy hat on the duck's head.





# Mini Rubber Duck - Green & Brown version

## Body

With brown yarn ch 2, sc 8 in second ch from hook.

- 01.** [inc] 8x (16 sts)
- 02.** [sc 1, inc] 8x (24 sts)
- 03.** [sc 2, inc] 8x (32 sts)
- 04 - 08.** (5 rnds) sc 32 (32 sts)
- 09.** sc 8, **cream color**, [dec] 8x, **brown color**, sc 8 (24 sts)

Now you will work the next round to close the top of the duck's body. To do this process you will work two stitches at a time. You must "split" the body into two sides using the first and last stitches of the round you just finished as a reference.

Remember that you will always work all the stitches in this round on two stitches (one on each side). First you will insert your hook into the first and last stitch, and so on...

- 10.** slst 8. Fasten off brown yarn. (8 sts)

Look at the chart on page 5 to help you.

Stuff the body.

## Head

Attach a new cream yarn. Jump to the next st (28th st of rnd 8).

- 01.** **cream color**, FLO [inc] 8x (16 sts)

Now continue working on round 1 of the head you just made.

- 02.** **green color**, [sc 1, inc] 8x (24 sts)
- 03 - 07.** (5 rnds) sc 24 (24 sts)

Put the black safety eyes between rnds 5 and 6. The first eye will be placed between stitches 8 and 9. The second eye will be placed between stitches 15 and 16.

- 08.** [sc 1, dec] 8x (16 sts)
- 09.** [dec] 8x (8 sts)

Stuff the head.

Close using the front loops of the last stitches.

If you've worked a little loosely, you may have a small gap between the end of the body seam and the start of the head. If so, you can optionally thread the thread used to finish the head into the body with your needle, then pull it out through this gap to add a few stitches and close it. Fasten off.

## Beak

To work the beak you must place the open part of the head facing you. You will work around three stitches of rnd 4. These sts are 11th, 12th and 13th.

You can use photo 9 on page 6 for your reference during the following explanation.

Attach a new orange yarn in 11th st between rnds 3 and 4.

- 01.** {ch 1 + hdc 1} in 11th st, hdc 1 in 12th st, hdc 1 in 13th st (4 sts)

Now turn the head 90 degrees to your right to work the second side of the beak. Insert the hook between sts 13th and 14th of rnd 4.

- 01.** hdc 1 (+1 sts)

Now turn the head 90 degrees to your right to work the third side of the beak. Insert the hook in 13th st between rnd 4 and 5.

- 01.** hdc 1 in 9th st, hdc 1 in 10th st, hdc 1 in 11th st (+3 sts)

Now turn the head 90 degrees to your right to work the last side of the beak. Insert the hook between sts 10th and 11th of rnd 4.

- 01.** hdc 1 (+1 sts)

Repeat the process to secure the tails of this part as you did in the previous design.

## Cheeks

To make the cheeks use light pink yarn and your needle. Just add 2 small stitches under each eye (1 st long). Place them between rnds 4 and 5, one st outward from each eye (photo 26).



## Left Wing

To make the left wing you will work from st 13 to 18 on rnd 7. You can add pins to help you. Place the lower part of the body facing you (and the head on the right side) to work this part.

Attach a new brown yarn between sts 13th and 14th on rnd 7 (*photo 27*).

- 01.** {ch 1 + sc 1} to the same st (*photo 28*) (2 sts)



Now work between sts 14th and 15th on rnd 14.

- 02.** hdc inc (2 sts)

Now work between sts 15th and 16th on rnd 14.

- 03.** hdc inc (2 sts)

Now work between sts 16th and 17th on rnd 14.

- 04.** sc (1 st)

Now work between sts 17th and 18th on rnd 14.

- 05.** {ch 1 + slst 1} to the same st (*photo 29*) (2 sts)

Repeat the process to secure the tails of this part as you did in the previous design (*photos 30 & 31*).



## Right Wing

To make the right wing you will work from st 18 to 23 on rnds 6 and 7. You can add pins to help you. Place the lower part of the body facing you (and the head on the left side) to work this part.

Attach a new brown yarn between sts 29th and 30th on rnd 6 (*photo 32*).

**01.** ch 1 (1 st)

Now work between sts 30th and 31th on rnd 6.

**02.** sc 1 (1 st)

Now work between sts 31th and 32th on rnd 6.

**03.** hdc inc (2 sts)

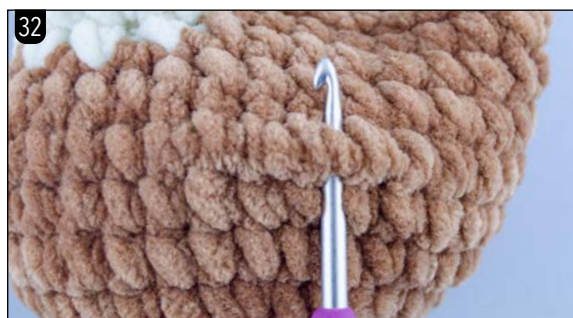
Now work between sts 32th on rnd 6 and 1st on rnd 7.

**04.** hdc inc (2 sts)

Now work between sts 1st and 2nd on rnd 7.

**05.** {sc 1 + ch 1 + slst 1} to the same st (3 sts)

Repeat the process to secure the tails of this part as you did in the previous design (*photos 33 & 34*).





# Mini Rubber Duck - Striped version

## Body

With white yarn ch 2, sc 8 in second ch from hook.

| <b>02.</b>      | <b>teal color</b> , [sc 1, inc] 8x  | (24 sts) |

| <b>04 - 05.</b> | <b>white color</b> , (2 rnds) sc 32 | (32 sts) |
| <b>06 - 07.</b> | <b>teal color</b> , (2 rnds) sc 32  | (32 sts) |
| <b>08.</b>      | <b>white color</b> , sc 32          | (32 sts) |
| <b>09.</b>      | sc 8, [dec] 8x, sc 8                | (24 sts) |

Now you will work the next round to close the top of the duck's body. To do this process you will work two stitches at a time. You must "split" the body into two sides using the first and last stitches of the round you just finished as a reference.

Remember that you will always work all the stitches in this round on two stitches (one on each side). First you will insert your hook into the first and last stitch, and so on...
