# Cuddle Up Pikachu

Amigurumi Snuggle Blanket Crochet Pattern

2017

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#### **Materials:**

- P Hook (11.50mm)
- K Hook (6.50mm)
- H Hook (5.00mm)
- Yarn Needle
- Worsted Weight Yarn: Bright Yellow (8 skeins), Black, White, and Bright Red



#### **Abbreviations:**

- Ch- chain
- Provided in the sext of the se
- Hdc- half double crochet
- 👲 LTFS- leave tail long for sewing
- R- round or row
- RD- indicates round/rows that will begin the decrease
- RH- indicates rounds that will make up the head/hood of the blanket
- 🕙 Sc- single crochet
- Sc2tog- one single crochet over 2 stitches (also known as a decrease)
- Slst-slip stitch
- St- stitch

#### Tips:

- Notes are included to help you along the way. Read the notes before making each piece.
- Keep in mind that <u>personality is created through the placement of the</u> facial features. Set the pieces into place before sewing.
- This pattern works from the bottom up
- Yarn is worked doubled unless noted
- 👲 The pattern is written for small adult/ teen





#### Pattern:

P Hook

**Bright Yellow** 

Ch52

R1: Starting in the third Ch from the hook; work 1dc in each Ch across (49) in the last Ch work 7dc; continue to work in the back of the Ch, (this will create a long round or oval shape) 1dc in the next 48dc; 6dc in the last (110) join with slst; ch3

R2: 1dc in the first 51dc; 3dc in the next 3dc; 1dc in the next 52dc; 3dc in the last 3dc (122) join with slst; ch2

R3: 1dc in each dc around (122) join with slst; ch2

Continue to repeat R3 until your work measures 45 inches or desired length.

RD1: (1dc in the first 59dc; dc2tog) 2 times (120) join with slst; ch2

RD2: (1dc in the first 13dc; dc2tog) 8 times (112) join with slst; ch2

RD3: (1dc in the first 12dc; dc2tog) 8 times (104) join with slst; ch2

RD4: (1dc in the first 11dc; dc2tog) 8 times (96) join with slst; ch2

RD5: (1dc in the first 10dc; dc2tog) 8 times (88) join with slst; ch2

HR1: 1dc in the first 27dc; Ch 34 and skip 34; 1dc in the next 27dc (88) join with slst; ch2

HR2: 1dc in the first 27dc; 34dc over the ch; 1dc in the remaining 27dc (88) join with slst; ch2

HR3-7: 1dc in each dc around (88) join with slst; ch2

HR8: (1dc in the first 2dc; dc2tog) 22 times (66) join with slst; ch2

HR9: (1dc in the first dc; dc2tog) 22 times (44) join with slst; ch2



#### **Pattern Continued:**

HR10: dc2tog around (22) join with slst; ch2

HR11: dc2tog around (11) join with slst; ch2

HR12- to end: Now working in continuous rounds; hdc2tog until the top is closed. Weave all ends.

#### Arms:

K Hook

**Bright Yellow** 

Make 2

#### Note:

R1-9 are worked in continuous rounds

Ch<sub>15</sub>

R1: Starting in the second ch from the hook; 1hdc in the first 13 ch; 3hdc in the last ch; continue to work in the back of the ch, (this will create a long round or oval shape) 1hdc in the next 12sc; 2hdc in the last (30)

R2: (1hdc in the first hdc; 2hdc in the next) 15 times (45)

R3-9: 1hdc in each hdc around (45)

R10: 1hdc in the first 27hdc; (27) ch1; turn

R11-23: 1hdc in each hdc across; (27) ch1; turn; at the end of R23; FO; LTFS


### Assembly:

Use the pictures as guides

Line the top of the arms up with the opening of the sleep sack



Sew along the three sides, the side, the bottom, and along the pocket edge made (as shown).



You will want to fold back the edge of the arm to sew under and along the pocket edge.



Do not sew across the top and weave remaining ends



#### Ears:

K Hook

Starting in Bright Yellow

Make 2

Leave a long starting tail for sewing

Ch 11

R1: Starting in the second ch from the hook; 1hdc in each ch across (10) ch1; turn

R2: 1hdc in each hdc across (10) ch1; turn

R3: 2hdc in the first hdc; 1hdc in the next 8hdc; 2hdc in the last hdc (12) ch1; turn

R4-10: 1hdc in each hdc across (12) ch1; turn

R11: 2hdc in the first hdc; 1hdc in the next 10hdc; 2hdc in the last hdc (14) ch1; turn

R12-25: 1hdc in each hdc across (14) ch1; turn; at the end of R25 FO; attach Black

R26-27: 1hdc in each hdc across (14) ch1; turn

R28: hdc2tog; (1hcd in the next 10hdc); hdc2tog (12) ch1; turn

R29: 1hdc in each hdc across (12) ch1; turn

R30: hdc2tog; (1hcd in the next 8hdc); hdc2tog (10) ch1; turn

R31: 1hdc in each hdc across (10) ch1; turn

R32: hdc2tog; (1hcd in the next 6hdc); hdc2tog (8) ch1; turn

R33: 1hdc in each hdc across (8) ch1; turn



#### **Ears Continued:**

R34: hdc2tog; (1hcd in the next 4hdc); hdc2tog (6) ch1; turn

R35: 1hdc in each hdc across (6) ch1; turn

R36: hdc2tog; (1hcd in the next 2hdc); hdc2tog (4) ch1; turn

R37: 1hdc in each hdc across (4) ch1; turn

R38: (hdc2tog) 2 times (2) ch1; turn

R39: 1hdc in each hdc across (2) ch1; turn

R40: hdc2tog (1) FO; Weave ends; leaving Bright Yellow starting tail for sewing.

#### **Assembly:**

Pin the ears along HR8 making sure that they are equal distance apart.
The ears will fall backward when in an upright position.

Weave ends

#### Cheeks:

H hook

Bright Red

Worked with single strand of yarn

Make 2

Continuous Rounds

Ch2

R1: 8sc into the second chain from the hook (8)

R2: 2sc in each sc around (16)

R3: (1sc in the first 1sc, 2sc in the next sc) 8 times (24)



#### **Cheeks Continued:**

R4: (1sc in the first 2sc, 2sc in the next sc) 8 times (32)

R5: (1sc in the first 3sc, 2sc in the next sc) 8 times (40)

R6: 1sc in each sc around (40) FO; LTFS

#### Eyes:

H Hook

Black

Worked with single strand of yarn

Make 2

Continuous Rounds

Ch2

R1: 6sc into the second chain from the hook (6)

R2: 2sc in each sc around (12)

R3: (1sc in the first 1sc, 2sc in the next sc) 6 times (18)

R4: (1sc in the first 2sc, 2sc in the next sc) 6 times (24)

R5: (1sc in the first 3sc, 2sc in the next sc) 6 times (30)

R6: 1sc in each sc around (30) FO; LTFS

#### **Eye Spots:**

H Hook

White

Continuous Rounds

Worked with single strand of yarn



#### **Eye Spots Continued:**

Make 2

Ch2

R1: 6sc into the second chain from the hook (6) FO; LTFS

#### **Assembly:**

- Use pictures as guides
- Pin the white light fleck to the inner top of the eye and sew.
- The cheeks will line up with the bottoms resting across HR2
- The eyes are sewn with the bottoms half way between HR6
- The nose is embroidered on HR6 between the eyes
- The mouth is sewn with the top middle point starting at the bottom of HR5 and directly centered and under the nose.
